

# The Monthly Word

Our lives can sometimes feel like they're a pile of ashes. We can be broken, shattered and destroyed. However, the good news of Jesus' life, death and resurrection is we can experience new life and have our lives raised from the ashes. This 6-week series is the perfect lead into resurrection Sunday (Easter), and a great way for new or seasoned believers to grow in their faith and understanding of Christ.

We started out on February 28<sup>th</sup> discussing "Temptations". We learned that first and foremost today we all need to acknowledge that temptation should be expected in our lives. We all experience temptation each and every day. No one is immune from the desires to have things or do things that do not align with the way of Christ. This can lead to things that we all would agree are devastating; broken marriages, ruined relationships, careers in the toilet, ministries closing down, the list goes on and on.



Our second topic on March 7<sup>th</sup> deals with the subject of "Humility". Jesus demonstrated humility by coming to earth from heaven and washing the feet of His disciples. When we choose to exercise humility, we look most like Christ to the world around us.

Week 3 we'll discuss "Contemplation". In the busyness of life, we often neglect our connection to the source of life. Drawing near to God through contemplative prayer is the way in which we experience the nearness of God. This is an intentional practice that won't happen by accident.

Week 4 we look at "Confession". Confession is the process of recognition of sin, turning from it and experiencing the forgiveness of God. Having a regular practice of searching our lives and coming into the light can cultivate a life full of grace and mercy as we rise from the ashes of past sins and poor decision making in our lives.

Week 5 we'll look at "Sacrifice" (Palm Sunday). The Hebrew people experienced the temporary forgiveness of sins by the blood of an animal sacrifice. The sacrifice of Jesus, to leave heaven and offer himself on the cross, was an atoning sacrifice that is effective throughout eternity. Through Christ we are completely redeemed from the ashes of our former life.

Week 6 We have arrived at the "Resurrection" (Easter). The centerpiece of the Christian faith is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The fact that Jesus rose from the dead gives hope to His followers that since death was defeated, then there is nothing that cannot be overcome. As believers, we identify with Jesus in His death by dying to our old self, and being raised to new life.

We've just barely cracked the door and gazed upon the Savior. His temptation, humility, sacrifice, prayer, and resurrection. You could spend a lifetime getting to know Jesus and never grow weary of it. He is the source, the promise, the way, the truth, and the life. Commit your life to Him today.

Rise up, dust off the ashes, and take a step of faith towards the Savior of all mankind. He's ready for you.

We are ready to see everyone again! Won't you consider spending some time with us this Lenten season. Come back and join us and we will grow in Christ together.

We are very excited to see the temperature rising and the snow melting! We're very much looking forward to spending some time outside at the park on Wednesday evenings.






