The Monthly Word FROM PASTOR TROY

PERFECTION ISN'T A REQUIREMENT

If you want to be used by God, you don't have to be a perfect person-but you do need to purify your heart. In February we celebrate St. Valentine's Day, so it is appropriate that we talk about our heart health when it comes to our relationship with Christ.

The Bible says in 2 Timothy 2:21,

"If a man cleanses himself from the latter, he will be an instrument for noble purposes, made holy, useful to the master and prepared to do any good work."

God uses all kinds of people. He uses shy people and outgoing people. He uses people of different races, different ages, stages of life, and backgrounds. He uses men and women. God will use plain vessels, and he'll use ornate vessels. He'll use big vessels and small vessels.

But there one thing that God will not use: He will not use a dirty vessel. You have to be clean on the inside. But there's good news: No matter who you are or what you've done, you can be made clean.


How do you do that? How do you become pure? You do it through a simple word: confession. Augustine, a Christian leader who lived a few hundred years after Jesus, said, "The confession of bad works is the beginning of good works." The Bible says in 1 John 1:9, "If we confess our sins to God, he will keep his promise and do what is right: he will forgive us our sins and purify us from all our wrongdoing".

The word "confess" in Greek is the word homologeo. Homo means "same," and logeo means "to speak." So homologeo literally means "to speak the same" as God does about my sin. It means you agree with him; "God, you're right. It wasn't a mistake. It was a sin. It was wrong." It doesn't mean you bargain with God (I'll never do it again"). It doesn't mean you bribe God ("I promise to read my Bible every day if you'll forgive me"). You just admit your sin.

That may seem too simple to you. You may say, "All I've got to do is admit it, and God will forgive me? Yes! It's called Grace.

This is when your brothers and sisters in Christ come around you to love and support you through whatever you're going through. It's not up to us to put you in the penalty box for what you've done and keep you hidden. God will deal with your heart, but if you've purified your heart with God then He will use you when and where needed.







YOUTH






WHAT IS SHROVE TUESDAY?

Shrove Tuesday (also known as Pancake Day) is the last day before Lent. It is traditional on this day to eat pancakes. Lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up. So Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. Pancakes are eaten on this day because they contain fat, butter and eggs which were forbidden during Lent. The name Shrove comes from the old word "Shrive" which means to confess. On Shrove Tuesday, in the Middle Ages, people used to confess their sins so that they were forgiven before the season of Lent began. Shrove Tuesday is celebrated the day before Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the season of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count). Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. During Ash Wednesday Service the minister will lightly rub the sign of the cross with ashes onto the forheads of worshipers. Historically, ashes signified purification of sorrow for sins.









