Summer is a time for vacations, at time to relax but no retreat. Here's a practical look at the believer's approach to a little R & R.

Vacation time has started. It's a season when many will pack the bags, round up the kids and head out of town to "get some R and R". A time to "just be me" –but not without the laptop, the cell phone, the portable DVD player and don't forget the Game system. Isn't it funny how we take it all so that we can "get away from it all"?

Getting away is important - Scripture is peppered with examples of Jesus getting away, sometimes with the twelve (and you thought it was tough just taking your four kids to Disney) - And sometimes by himself. I think it's cool to see Jesus in these settings.

God doesn't call us to be Lone Rangers. He calls us to be a Body!


We all need time to relax ~ but don't retreat!

Here's a few lessons we can take some lessons from Jesus:


- 1. He knew when to get away.

- 9. He had a renewed focus when He returned


