

### Making the Ordinary, Extraordinary.

Throughout Scripture, we discover that nothing is as common as it seems, not even bread. Bread fell from heaven as a sign of God's provision; bread became a metaphor for the law of the Lord. Jesus fed the multitudes with loaves of bread and referred to himself as "the bread of life." Then, on the night that he was handed over to suffering and death, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to His disciples as a picture of His body being given for the life of the world.

It is the very commonness of bread that makes it the perfect metaphor for our lives. If we're honest, most of what we do is ordinary. We get up, go to work-paid or unpaid-tinker at our hobbies, and try to do our best. We transport children around, work on our yard, and grocery shop. For the most part, nothing about our daily lives sets us apart from the people around us. It's just life. Like bread, it's ordinary.

Do you see yourself this way? Maybe you've settled for this to be you and your life. Maybe you are living with an unsustainable manic drive, grasping and grabbing for something that always feels just out of reach. Maybe you're wrestling with an unkind voice-the one that says that you just don't matter, that you're "less than" and "never enough."

Well, there is good news for you and your situation. There is more to this life than what you see. Join us this month as we look into the Gospel of Luke which records stories about Jesus taking bread in His hands, blessing it, breaking it, and giving it. As believers it is so important that we see ourselves as God sees us. It is important that we understand that our brokenness makes us open to the grace of God. And finally, it is imperative that we take our seat at the table of fellowship and share the testimony of our lives with others.

During this time of the year as we transition from summer to fall, let God repurpose and help you to realize that we were created to be extraordinary in an ordinary world.






